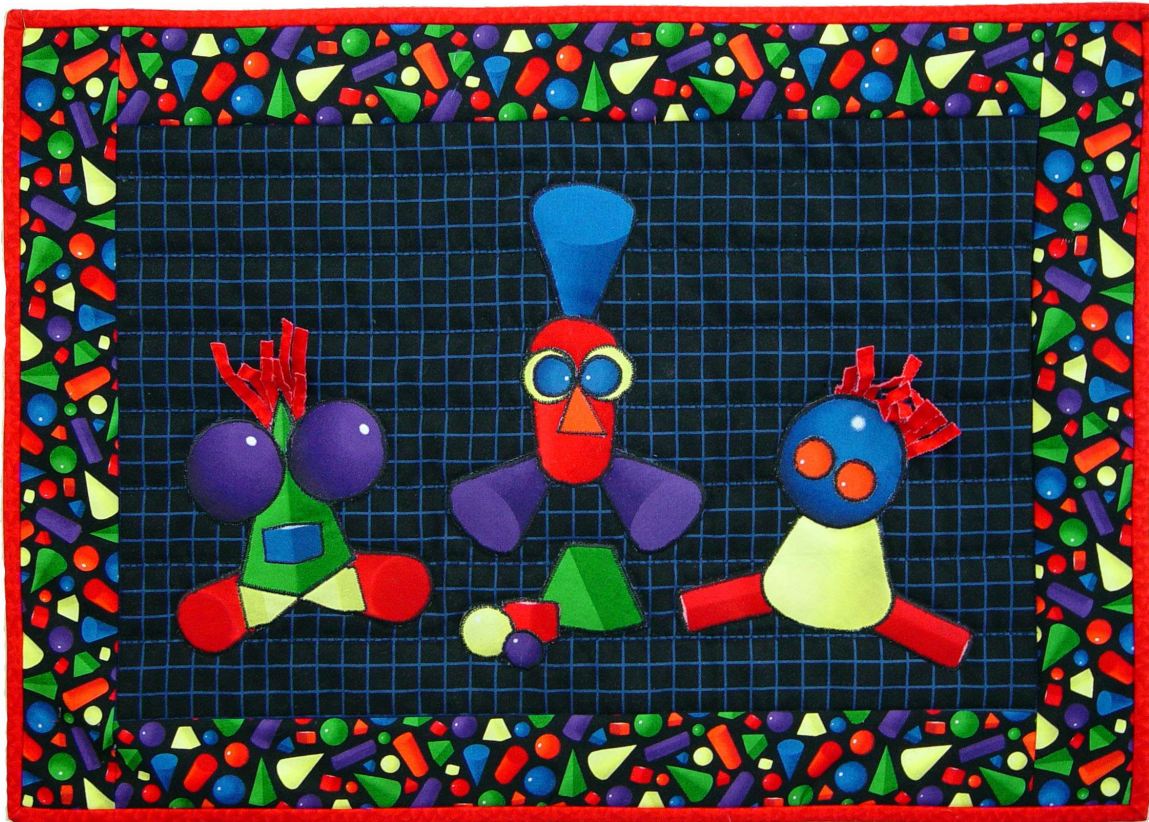


# Make-Your-Own **GeoPets**



## **GeoPets: A Silly Project Idea by Bethany Reynolds**

The sample quilt is 16" x 22 1/2". Your pets may need more or less room to play. The sample is made from 7 Fat Quarters of the Stack-n-Whack® GeoMagic II Collection by Bethany Reynolds for Blank Quilting - enough for the quilt top, backing, and binding. You will also need about 1 yard of fusible web, and an 18" x 24" piece pf batting for the size shown.

Instructions: Fuse web to the back of the symmetrical stripe fabric (4197) and the large allover print (4192).\* Cut out shapes for the GeoPet bodies and features, using the symmetrical prints for feet, the larger geometric shapes for bodies, and the spheres for eyes. You can use the photo as a guide, but it is really fun to make up your own!

Cut the grid print (4194) to an appropriate size- the sample quilt background is 12" x 18 1/2". Arrange your Pets on the grid. Pay special attention to the eyes- slight rotations can give you wonderful expressions! You can add hair and other 3-D features by bonding together two layers of fabric using Heat-n-Bond® UltraHold. Once bonded, the fabric can be cut without fraying. When you like your arrangement, fuse the pieces in place. For a more finished look, stitch around the edges with a satin stitch.

Add 3 1/2" wide borders cut from the small allover print (4195). Cut a piece of backing from one of the remaining prints, 2-3" larger than your quilt top. Layer with backing and quilt as desired. Bind using one of the other fat quarters.

\*Darker colors may show through the yellow shapes. To minimize this, you can fuse a layer of interfacing to the back of the yellow areas before adding the fusing web, or trim away underlapping parts before fusing them down.
